As much as possible, topics were assigned based on interests identified in the first day survey. The schedule was based on a logical flow of topics. If you want to trade topics with someone and they agree, let me know. The dates for the **topics** are fixed. The student listed is responsible for the talk identified, but if you want to team up with 1 or 2 others, you may do so (3 per “team” maximum). The others can help you, and you will help them.

The talks should be educational and interesting. Discuss the technical highlights of subject (for example, if you are discussing galaxies then you’d probably explain what a galaxy is, the different classifications of galaxies, how they form and evolve, etc.). Also discuss what an amateur astronomer should know if they want to observe it.

The talks should be about 15 minutes. Powerpoint is recommended. You must submit an electronic copy of your presentation to me (Dr. Lulay) one class meeting prior to your presentation date. If you are giving a presentation on a Thursday, submit it to me by class-time on Tuesday. If you are giving it on Tuesday, then it needs submitted by class time on the preceding Thursday. Earlier than that is recommended. I will look through the presentation and make recommendations for changes with 24 hours (hopefully).
